FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Holidays are very important. Holidays are for you to be with your own people, your family, your language, your law. vour music. When you are at home you are not Yirara students - you are a Warlbiri young man, an Alyawarra girl, a Gurindju promised wife, or a Pitjantjatjara boy. Be proud of your people - they're one of the best in the world. Be proud of your language - speak it at home (don't speak English) and speak it well. Be proud of your law - obey it and listen to parents and old people; a weak law means a weak people. Be proud of your culture - a good culture and a changing culture. Remember that there are only about 15,000 tribal Aboriginals from the deserts of Central Australia. That is a very small number compared with the millions of Chinese and the millions of Europeans. Look after those 15,000 and wherever you are in the holidays - Nutwood Downs, Neutral Junction or Lake Nash - make sure your little part of the 15,000 is a strong part, where Aboriginals are proud of being Aboriginals.

- If there are ceremonies, go to them and sing if you can with the older people. If you are <u>in</u> the ceremonies, don't run away.
- Speak your own language all the time.
- Tell stories and listen to stories stories from the old days, dreamtime stories, funny stories from last week. Listen to the old people; they know a lot.
- Travel round to see other parts of "your" country. Go hunting.
- Help your family to do jobs go to the store, fix the car, get firewood, help with the babies.
- read something every day.
- wash yourself and your clothes every day.

When it's time for Yirara again, remember that Term 1, 1982 starts on Monday, January 25th. That is a 7 week holiday. Remember too that you must send me a message if you are stuck somewhere. If you don't get back early, you will not be allowed to return. That means - early returners get education, late returners bad luck. Bring \$20 too.

I hope you all have a very happy holiday at home. After such a good and hard-working 1981 year at Yirara, you deserve the holiday. My best wishes to you - and your families,

Yirara entered the 1981 N.T. Tidy Towns Competition in the Small Communities, under 600 (population) Throughout the year, all the students and staff worked to get the college looking its best. A new fence around the new land next to Yirara was started; big clean-ups at the back of Yirara and down the southern side took place; new trees were planted around the college, grassed areas surrounded by trees were planted on the new land to allow parents to camp in clean areas; the college emblem was repainted, as was the main sign at the entrance to the college. Dormitory windows were cleaned and the compound near Manual Arts was cleaned up. SWIMMING DAY


In October, some Aboriginal classes and Schools came to Yirara to spend the day swimming and having swimming lessons. It was good to see these children:



FINGERSPELLING ALPHABET





Some people lose their hearing. Others never had it to start with; they never learnt to speak, or understand how to use language.

Some hearing impaired people hear most sounds, others hear a few sounds, and yet others hear nothing at all.

Many hearing impaired patients can lipread, but it will help if you use obvious gestures. For some you will need to write what you want to say, or use the finger spelling alphabet shown in this pamphlet.

Often their voice is different and a little hard to understand. But remember that some patients who talk normally may still not hear properly. Deafness is not always obvious.

P 1 onion - chopped


1 x 425g can whole tomatoes


1 x 300g can red kidney beans (or baked beans)

Add onion and chilli. Cook till brown.




Add tomatoes, beans and salt and pepper. Cook.

The Councils have also given money to help children in Alice Springs Hospital; they are sometimes lonely without their parents, Yirara students, through the Prefect Councils, have helped poor people and sick people, and I'm sure these people will be pleased and grateful.

The blokes Council has been busy. They are trying to repair the mini-bike and gave \$52.00 for this. They helped Top M buy a new T.V.- theirs was broken: And they gave some money for trophies for the Yirara under 15 Footballers.

The girls Council has bought a new and expensive pool table - for girls.

Thank you to the two councils for their work in Term 3, and for the films they got for Intercollegiate.

CT. TNTC Our Health Clinic is very important at Yirara. If someone feels sick, it is hard to feel happy, and it is hard to learn how to do things at school. At Yirara, students come to clinic for treatment for their sores and sicknesses, so that we can keep Yirara a happy and healthy place where we can all learn from each other. In 1982, we started our own Dental Clinic - to look after the students' teeth and to teach Aboriginal Dental Health Workers how to do treatments for people at their home communities. We are proud of Graeme Beasley from Ali Curung, and Matthew Egan from Yuendumu - 2 ex-students from Yirara. who are learning to become Dental Health Workers. We have two Dentists. Mr. Bruce Simmons and Miss Debbie Miller. Every year, all students have an Audiogram (Listening test) and an eye test (to make sure they can see well). If they need any immunizations (needles to stop sickness like T.B., Tetanus or Polio), then we give them: I am very proud of Yirara students. They are always very good and helpful when it is needle or test time. No-one likes needles - but Yirara students realise that they are important to stay healthy. Next year, some students will come to Yirara with some sores or sickness. They will learn how to look after themselves - Our clinic is our health classroom.

MEDICAL CARDS

With the new arrangements for charging patients who visit a hospital in the Northern Territory, parents are advised to apply for a medical card from the Social Security Department. The Community Sister will have details of how to get a card.

The Alice Springs Hospital will be charging parents if their children go to hospital.

Yirara College will need to know the number of the student's parent's medical card- if they have one- so the Health Department will see their children for free.

People who do not have a card will receive a bill from the Health Department and should send their money to the Health Department.

It is in your interest to see of you can apply for a card to get free medical service in the town hospitals for you and your family.
